



COVID-19, as a Global Pandemic Disaster, means EVERY PERSON in the US and in the world IS a disaster survivor.






- Societal "norms" are no longer norms.

Most Disasters have a secondary Disaster



He received a Master of Science degree in 2011 from CU-Boulder with a focus on climate science, policy and philosophy and his thesis was entitled "Truth and Climate Change: Pragmatist Truth Confronted by Habermas and Ratzinger in the Context of Climate Change".
